How To Remove a WD-40 Spot on Limestone

Q. I accidentally wiped my limestone fire surround on one side with a cloth that had WD-40. It has discolored the limestone that is stone in color. The discolored area is a few shades darker. How can I bring it back to the lighter color it should be? Thank you.

A. A poultice can draw the WD-40 out of your limestone. Your poultice ingredients will be a good degreaser mixed with an absorbent medium, such as diatomaceous earth, poultice powder, or household flour. Our <u>Stain</u> <u>Management App</u>, has more information about poulticing and how to mix and apply a poultice. If the stain lightens, then keep reapplying the poultice until the stain disappears completely. Be aware that the stone may absorb moisture from the poultice. This will dry out within a few hours or days, depending on the humidity level of the environment. If you are unable to remove the stain, consult with your professional stone restoration contractor.
